Overview of Building Codes

Definition of Interior Design (NCIDQ)

Interior design includes a scope of services performed by a professional design practitioner, qualified by means of education, experience, and examination, to protect and enhance the health, life safety and welfare of the public.

Definition of Building Code (Webster)

A set of rules of procedure and standards of materials designed to secure uniformity and protect the public interest in such matters as building construction and public health, established usually by a public agency and commonly having the force of law in a particular jurisdiction.

Definition of "Standard of Care" for a Interior Designer

Actions that any other well-informed practitioner would have taken given the same level of knowledge in the same situation.

International Building Code (IBC) & International Residential Code (IRC) by International Code Council (ICC)

Federal Codes

American Disability Act 1990 (ADA - revised in 2010) – law, not code Federal Fair Housing Act (FFHA)

State Codes

California – adopted and amended model code

Local Jurisdictions

Cities – adopted and amended State code, or independent City Code (SF)

NFPA (National Fire Protection Agency) NFPA-101 Life Safety Code NFPA-13 Fire Sprinklers NFPA-70 National Electric Code

CALGreen – California Green Building Standards Tier 1 Mandatory, Tiers 2 & 3 as adopted by local jurisdictions LEED – Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design – voluntary or as prescribed by local jurisdictions
